

## "Do not be afraid!...He has been raised"

Alleluia! The Lord is Risen. Alleluia!

Today, on this first day of the week, let us rejoice with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary as we hear the angel announce: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for He has been raised just as he said."

But how real is this Easter joy for you? And for our needy brothers and sisters?

The day after Jesus was buried, the women, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb? (Mark 16:1-4)? And then when they arrived, "while it was still dark, (they) saw the stone removed from the tomb!"

Most probably the many people that you have extended some help last lent, you again will encounter one of these days and will still be begging help from you. And when that happens, we probably asked ourselves has the Lord really rose from the dead for them. Who will roll the stone away for them to encounter the risen Christ?

But let not our hearts be dismayed. Easter is not about finding a solution to all of the world's problem. Easter joy is recognizing the presence of an authentic hope among us because we know and believe that Christ is truly alive among us.

Let this authentic hope in the Risen Lord assures us that it is He and not us who will take, bless and break and multiply the blessings that we want to share with them.

This year, our school fell short of some of its financial obligations due to an aggressive budget which promoted expansion and capital improvements. As a result, the church has pledged to assist our school by lending money from its savings to help carry it through the end of the fiscal year. All funds borrowed by our school will be paid back to the church in a timely fashion. The school is a direct ministry of our church, and it is our obligation to support it when possible. Rest assured, any funds used to help our school will come from the church savings and NOT from the Donor-Restricted funds set aside for the Parish Hall. Furthermore, the church and school will work together to create a repayment schedule to ensure a timely return of these funds.

As a friendly reminder to everyone, this is OUR school. It belongs to St. Joseph Church, and we strongly encourage anyone in the parish with children to consider sending them to St. Joseph School. Just as the church assists its ministries, our school will help its parishioners who qualify for financial assistance. Please contact our school for more information.

We are doing the Lord's work through all our ministries, and we thank each of you for your continued support of our initiatives. Let us enter into this Easter season as people of the resurrected Lord, with joy and thanksgiving. God bless you and all you do for St. Joseph Church!
