Weekly Reflections: Sunday of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

### "I am the living bread... the bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world."

Every time we come for Holy Communion, the priest proclaims: "The Body of Christ" to which the we are called to respond: "Amen." This in itself is an affirmation of faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, which we celebrate this Sunday as the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or more popularly known as Corpus Christi.

The gospel helps us ponder the significance of what we celebrate today: Jesus presents to us a gift of his body that is immensely superior to the Manna in the desert. His gifts of bread and wine become the source of eternal life for as He proclaims: "I am the living bread… the bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world."

To partake of this Living Bread is to share the life of Jesus who is Eternal but first of all, it entails our willingness to be identified and be a disciple of Jesus. It would be good therefore to ask ourselves, having received Jesus in Holy Communion for as long as we can remember, have we been transformed to become His Body, His Presence in our world today? Have we become more Christ-like in our words, in our actions, in our dealings with the people and with the world? Do people see the Christ that dwells in us because we have received Him in the Eucharist?

With St. Augustine, let us pray for the grace to become what we receive. We receive the Body of Christ, may we become the Body of Christ – a bread broken and shared to respond to hungers of the human family.



# Receiving Sacraments "Out of Order" Reflections on the Original Order Diocese of Honolulu Questions? kdeneve@rcchawaii.org

Did you know that children baptized as infants usually receive the sacraments out of sequence, out of order? To be fully initiated as Christians, as followers of Jesus Christ, we receive three sacraments, namely Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation. When Confirmation comes last, perhaps even years after First Communion, we can get the impression that Confirmation is the "final" sacrament, that Confirmation is what brings us fully into the Body of Christ.

This is not true. Our faith tells us that Eucharist, not Confirmation, is the source and summit of our faith tells us that First Communion is what completes our initiation into the life of Christ.

In 1971, Blessed Pope Paul VI issued the revised Rite of Confirmation saying "The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and finally are sustained by the food of eternal life in the Eucharist...... the faithful, after being signed by holy Baptism and Confirmation, are incorporated fully into the body of Christ by participation in the Eucharist" (Apostolic Constitution, "Divinae Consortium Naturae," 1971).

Over the coming weeks, we'll more fully explore these three sacraments as well as the upcoming changes our diocese is making to establish the original order of the three sacraments of initiation.

Please pray for those in our parish who are working to help us transition into the Restored Order of Sacraments.


