Weekly Reflection:

#### 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time Year A

"When he finds a pearl of great price..."


In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of a worker who found a hidden treasure while tilling the land. Burying it again, he then sold everything and bought the land. In the succeeding parable, Jesus speaks of a merchant's search for fine pearls. When he found one of great price, he also sold everything he owned and bought it. What is this hidden treasure or pearl of great price that will be worth everything we have?

In life, we must discover for ourselves what really is worth pursuing. The tragedy would be when one acquires a pearl and finds out it is not the real thing. When one has spent all this time and effort, foregone his integrity and values, sacrificed his family and friends that he loves for the sake of what the world calls important, what has he accomplished? Love for country, Family, friends, and personal dignity and honor are pearls of great price. But what will be more precious than our relationship with God who is not only the source of our lives but of the eternity that awaits us. Indeed, "What does it profit a man to gain the whole world, but lose his soul?"

Thus, for Jesus, the Reign of God in our hearts and in our life, is the buried treasure or the pearl of great price. The Lord is asking us to search for this treasure and pearl, and once we find it, we must not be afraid to sacrifice everything to possess it.

But most of us can be so busy and distracted that we easily loss sight of what is most important. The lure of the world and our conflicting desires blur our vision of the kingdom of God. Our love for God, and our longing to become authentically loving people, clash with other passions within us, like the desire for status and prestige, for power and pleasure. Likewise, the fear of cost it entails, makes the heart hesitate to pursue the reign of God in one's life.

Let us pray that we may have the true wisdom to know and desire the only thing that really matters - Jesus' Reign in our hearts - and once in our possession, to live its values throughout our lives.


