

Sacramental Marriage Validation Celebration

In preparation for a very special centennial event, St. Joseph Church will feature a Mass Marriage Validation with our Bishop Larry Silva on March 23, 2019 at 2:00 pm. Couples who wish to have a sacramental marriage in the church or wish to have their marriage annulled should consider the following:

Cannot Marry in the Catholic Church due to a Prior Marriage?

Pope Francis recently streamlined the process to petition for a declaration of nullity (annulment) to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the mandatory fee. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior marital bond was invalid for some reason, then he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage. “This is my Body... this is my Blood.”

Back then, we always referred to the Eucharist as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We believed and accepted that it is the sacrifice of Jesus Himself on the cross, but it was also the sacrifice of the Church wherein the faithful united themselves to the offering of Christ. But today we seem we have become allergic to making sacrifices because this means suffering and pain and self-denials. We seek rather self-fulfillment or satisfaction. And so we now less and less speak of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Today’s Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi invites us to revisit what it means that Jesus did offer himself as a sacrifice. At the Passover meal, Jesus took bread and said: “This is My body.” Then He took a cup of wine and said: “This is My blood, the blood of the covenant. Despite losing many of His disciples because of this Jesus insisted that His flesh was real food and His blood real drink. This would be his lasting gift for all of us, the gift of His Real Presence - a presence that will be with us all the days of our lives.

But the greater consequence of our faith in the real presence of Christ in Eucharist, is to become what we receive. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ, then we must be ready to become the Body and Blood of Christ today! We must be a witness to fullness of life that Christ offers and be also life-giving to others.

This year the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ falls on June 3rd.

The feast—also known as *Corpus Christi* (Latin for “Body of Christ”)—originated in France in the 13th century through the efforts of St. Juliana of Liège and was extended to the Universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. In the US the date is set on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. While we meet the Lord in the sacrament of the Eucharist in every Mass, the focus of *Corpus Christi* is to remind of us of his real presence in the Blessed Sacrament and his role as the head of the Church, the Body of Christ. In his 2017 homily for the Solemnity, Pope Francis explained that the “Eucharist is flavored with Jesus’ words and deeds, the taste of his Passion, the fragrance of his Spirit. When we receive it, our hearts are overcome with the certainty of Jesus’ love... The Eucharist also reminds us that we are not isolated individuals, but *one body*. The Eucharist is not a sacrament ‘for me’; it is the sacrament of the many, who form one body, God’s holy and faithful people. Saint Paul reminded us of this: “Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread” (1 Cor 10:17). The Eucharist is the *sacrament of unity*.”

As part of this Solemnity, we are also reminded that the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament—whether in the tabernacle or ex-

posed on the altar—is a continuation of the adoration which occurs at every Mass, “Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.” Devotion toward the Eucharist—outside of Mass and in accord with liturgical norms—is encouraged “to extend the union with Christ that the faithful have reached in communion.” This may be done in silent adoration before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle or in the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction.

For the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, all are invited to spend some time in Eucharistic adoration on June 3rd. It is a wonderful opportunity to extend our communion with Jesus and each other as the Body of Christ. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the 9am Mass for silent adoration and reposed before the 11:45am Mass. Creative adoration, led by Fr. Zaldy Norba, will start at 1:30pm. Come be inspired by our Lord’s gift of self!






Celebration

Sacrifice


We remember that Christ's supper is united to his redeeming cross.
