The seed of the Reign of God

With all that we see happening in the world, we probably ask: “Where is God? And why is he not doing anything to help us?”

To questions such as these, we hear Jesus telling us the us the Parables of the Growing Seed and the Mustard Seed . The Parable of the growing seed tells us that the Reign of God will definitely come about as its seed has a built-in power to grow to maturity while the second teaches that His Reign, though of humble beginnings, is destined for greatness.





Sacramental Marriage Validation Celebration (continued)

St. Joseph will have a centennial event of a Mass Marriage Validation with Bishop Silva on March 23, 2019 at 2:00 pm at St. Joseph Church. Couples who wish to have a sacramental marriage in the church or wish to have their marriage annulled should contact their parish priest. St. Joseph couples can contact Rose Nunogawa at 935-1465.

Pope Francis recently streamlined the process for a declaration of nullity to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the fees. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior marital bond was invalid for some reason, the he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage.

Marriage Preparation will include:

- Prenuptial interview
- Completion of documentation
- Communication Session
- Seminar on Marriage
- Sacramental Session with Parish Priest

Civil Marriages will need: Civil Marriage Certificate and Baptismal Certificates (for Catholics)

Couples Living Together will need: Baptismal Certificate Document (for Catholics)

Divorced Couples will need:

- Annulment number or certificate (from Tribunal & Canonical Office)
- Divorce decree (from lawyer)
- Marriage certificate (from State Health Dept)
- Baptismal certificate (for Catholics)
