

Weekly Reflection: 2nd Sunday of Lent – Cycle C - 2019

“Let us make three tents...”

For Peter, James and John the experience in the Mount of Transfiguration was a moment of revelation. Having a glimpse of Our Lord Jesus in His divine splendor, Peter was so overtaken by the experience that he wanted that they remain there and build three tents – for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. Had Jesus listened to Peter, then, yes there will be 3 beautiful tents in the mountain but there also will not have been the 3 crosses at Calvary. Peter’s requests was a temptation to keep Jesus was embracing his mission.

But with Jesus’ response, the Transfiguration was an invitation for the apostles to make it also their own. It was meant to help them resolve their crisis of faith. They have to reckon with understanding what it means that Jesus, the anointed one of God, must embrace His mission of offering His life for the salvation of the world. And if Jesus takes up His cross, so must his followers be able to do likewise lovingly like their master. The Transfiguration was intended to prepare them to accept their mission.

They went up the mountain to pray and it was meant to transform them. This is also the invitation for us in our praying this Lenten Season. Let us pray that we be transfigured into the likeness of the Lord in embracing the will of the Father – aligning n our hearts and minds to the plan of the Father as we “listen to Him.”



OKRA STEW
Makes 4 servings



- 2 T fair trade olive oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 16 oz bag frozen cut okra
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 2 t ground cumin
- 1 t ground cinnamon
- ½ t ground allspice
- 1 can diced tomatoes
- 2 c vegetable stock


Heat olive oil in large pot. Sauté onions until brown. Add okra, garlic and spices. Once okra is lightly browned, add tomatoes and vegetable stock. Simmer, uncovered, for 40 minutes or until okra is soft and stew thickens.




