

“Once there was a rich man...”

People rummaging through the trash bins around the city for tins and plastics they can sell to earn some money is no longer a rare occurrence. We see them every day. The story in the gospel is not too far from our reality today.

The parable of the reversal of fortune of the poor man Lazarus and the rich man in the after-life is supposed to be a wake up call for our sleepy hearts and consciences. There is no reason to suppose that the rich man got his wealth illegally nor that Lazarus was a truly holy man. The only thing certain that we know is that the rich man did nothing for Lazarus as he sits at the gate of his house. If there is any crime, the rich man is guilty of, it will be indifference. With his resources, he could have shared a piece of bread to Lazarus, but unfortunately, he did not. His is the sin of omission.

Many of us are lacking in material things. But as St. Pope John Paul tells us: **“Nobody is so poor that he has nothing to give, and nobody is so rich that he has nothing to receive.”**


