

"If you love Me..."

Do you want to see Jesus? Especially these days, when the future seems bleak and dreary, in our hearts we know that only our Lord Jesus can bring us that light that can brighten our days.

In today's gospel, Jesus assures his disciples "in a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live." This is all part of h His farewell address to His disciples before He would go through His final Passover from death to life -- in Jerusalem. And here He reminds us that we can see him if we look through through the lens of love: the love of the Father, the love of Jesus and the love for Jesus which means keeping his commandments: ""If you love me, you will keep my commandments... And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Loving Jesus therefore is not just something emotional; loving Jesus means conforming our lives to the desires of God for us. And yes it might mean working on our personalities and characters, overcoming sinful habits, stretching ourselves to love as Jesus loved. Can we do it?

Well, Jesus also assures them that He will send the Holy Spirit, the Advocate to be their strength...our strength. By doing so, Jesus knows that the Holy Spirit will help us deepen our the knowledge of God and our love for Him because the same Spirit will help us experience the love of God in everyday life.

So during these days that we have more time because of the quarantine to reflect and assess our relationship with God, how have we really loved God? And how has this love been manifested in the way that we live and relate with the people around us? How can we be more loving in our words, in our action and in our prayer?

BEWARE-COVID-19 Scam Emails



This past weekend, a parishioner received an email claiming to be from Bishop Larry Silva requesting gift cards to help a priest with COVID-19. This is a scam email. DO NOT reply to the email, ignore and delete it.

Bishop Silva has reconfirmed that he will never send an email asking an individual for money, gift cards or any other gift. Hallmark signs of phishing and scam emails often include bad grammar, bad spelling, threats to do damage, and a short deadline to pay money with a link.

Below are some tips if you receive a phishing or scam email:

- Don't reply back to the sender. Doing so alerts the sender to the fact that this is a live email account.
- Instead, call the alleged sender directly on their official phone line and ask if they sent the email.
- Don't click on any links in the email. Instead hover over a link to see the full web address and whether it might be coming from a suspicious site that could install malware on your computer or try and get your sensitive information like log-ins, personal data or financial details.

Enter through the Kapiolani & Haili Side Entrance Exit through the Haili Side Exit Only


