

Solemnity of Christ the King – 2020

“Lord, when did we see you...?”

As we end the liturgical year with the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, we are reminded that we are but pilgrims on this world. But as we are just passing through this world when the final days come what are we leaving behind? And what memories do we take with us – are we grateful or regretful? In the Gospel, both the sheep-like and the goat-like share the same question: “Lord, when did we see you hungry, thirsty, naked, sick and in prison...? And when you reflect upon it, what is utterly confounding is that neither the sheep nor the goats have any idea what they are doing when they do - or fail to do - those works of mercy that impact their eternal destiny. Undeniably, if we see Jesus in need, who would refuse to help Him? But precisely we are unable to recognize Him that we do what we do.

I guess, we are being reminded of what LOVE truly is. That we love and care for those in need for who they are. This is how Jesus loves. Seeing and finding Jesus in them is an aftermath. It is a result of a decision: that we are reminded that this is exactly what Jesus would have done for this person in need. But this does not mean that God was not there in the beginning. To love is a gift, a grace from the Spirit. We then have become an instrument and channel of the mercy and love of God! Happy Thanksgiving Day and be reminded that next Sunday, we begin the first Sunday of Advent.




