22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time – August 29, 2021 (B)

"This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me..."

What does it take to be a good follower of Christ? Or what does it mean to be a true Christian? Some think it is simply about observing diligently our religious rites and practices like going to Mass or praying the rosary.

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that it takes more than that. Just as Christ confronted some of the Jewish leaders for reducing their into mere observance of the laws like the precepts of ritual purity or cleanliness. For them it was enough to be assured of God's approval and to be considered righteous. But for Jesus it was farthest from reality as he warns them "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me..."

Hopefully, we do not fall into the same trap. Because if it is only about ritual purity then with the COVID protocol of washing our hand s often, today's people will be considered righteous. But for Jesus a true practice of religion is revealed in what happens inside our hearts – our experiencing God's unconditional love and becoming a channel of that love to our brothers and sisters. Then our coming to church and prayer becomes a witness to what we have become – true sons and daughters of the Father and true disciples of Our Lord Jesus. Even our washing of hands and wearing our masks become an act of charity if done out of our desire to protect not only ourselves but others.
