Solemnity of Christ the King – 2021 (B)

To bear witness to the truth

As we celebrate today’s solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, we are invited to reflect on the relevance of the reality of “King and Kingdom” in our present world. While they evoke the idea of Riches and Power, this Sunday’s Gospel certainly reveals an entirely different reality. While Pilate tried to assert his control in saying: “Do you not know that I have power to release you and power to crucify you?”, he, however, demonstrated how fragile his power is when he handed Jesus over to be crucified.

On the other hand Jesus calls our attention to a different direction when he said: “My kingdom is not of this world.” “Yes, I am a king, I was born for this; for this I came into the world, to bear witness to the truth and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.” For Jesus, being king is all about testifying to the truth. He would be king to those who choose to embrace the truth – the Truth which is God and His love for all creation.

For us, therefore, who would claim that Jesus is Our King, and desire to be part of His Kingdom, it will entail embracing the truth of God’s love and mercy which is a gift that He freely offers to us. On our part, his will entail our readiness to make a gift of our selves the way Jesus made a gift of Himself so that the love of God be made known. We are transformed to be the very gift that we have received – the Face of God’s loving presence. Let it always be the prayer in our heart: “Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done..”



Subject: **UPDATED LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES FOR THE NEW LITURGICAL YEAR DURING THE TIME OF PANDEMIC**

The following are the updated liturgical directives and reminders that impact all Catholic churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions in the Diocese of Honolulu during the time of pandemic **effective the First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021.**

Singing at Mass: Singing by both a choir and congregation is now **allowed**. Masks must be worn as a mitigation effort. Other mitigation measures (e.g., increased physical distancing and improved ventilation) should be considered and implemented.

Hymnals and Other Printed Materials: All hymnals and missalettes may be returned to the pews and used. Pastors may choose to continue printing Worship Aids and/or project Music texts while following copyright/licensing guidelines. Printed bulletins and other materials may be handed out.

Collection Baskets: Collection baskets should not be passed from person to person, but people may place their offering in a basket in front of the altar or in a locked box as they enter the church. As an alternative, ushers may use collection baskets with handles or may pass through the aisles while holding the baskets.

All prior memos, directives and protocols are still in effect unless changed in this memo.

Adult Catechists for the Sunday RCIA Class

Requirements for Catechists

A Catechist is a role model of Catholic teachings and values.

- Be at least 21 years of age and be Fully Initiated in the Catholic Church.
- Be a practicing Catholic. Have a good standing in the Church.
- Participate regularly in Sunday Mass and participate as fully as possible in a sacramental lifestyle.
- Adhere to the Catholic Church's teachings on morality and behavior. The Religious Education program is not a forum for personal beliefs not in conformity with these teachings.
- Complete Diocesan requirements for catechist including completing volunteer application, completing online criminal background check through the diocese, and becoming EIM compliant according to diocese guidelines. (Mandatory diocesan Safe Environment required for direct contact with minors).
- Work as a team with the Pastor, DRE, co-catechists, other members of the religious education team, the pastoral staff, clergy, and parents and to recognize that parents are the primary catechists of their children.
- Continue own faith formation through participation at workshops, courses, retreats, bible studies or other avenues.

*Teens are not considered catechist - only classroom helpers. Even if they can teach the class by themselves, they should not.
