1. What is Divine Mercy?

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. A nine day novena can be said from Good Friday to the Vigil Sunday of Divine Mercy.

2. When was it made part of the Church's calendar?

On April 30th, 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and during the ceremony he declared:

"It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called "Divine Mercy Sunday".

3. On Divine Mercy Sunday we focus on the message from Jesus about his Mercy written in the Diary of St. Faustina. Here are a few messages:

St. Faustina received this visionary inspiration: "My daughter, say that I am love and mercy personified" (Diary 1074).

Another message: "Let the weak, sinful souls have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the unmeasurable depths of My mercy." (Diary 1059)

Written in the diaries of St. Faustina: "Before I come as a just Judge, I first open wide the door of My mercy. He who refuses to pass through the door of My mercy must pass through the door of My justice....(Diary 1146).

Whoever will recite (chaplet) it will receive great mercy at the hour of death....Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy.....I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy..... (Diary 687). Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you..... When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior.... (Diary 1541). Through the chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will. (Diary 1731).

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, the chaplet is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist. It may be said any time, but our Lord specifically requested that it be used as a novena on the nine days before the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday (The first Sunday after Easter).

It is also especially appropriate to say the chaplet during the 3 o'clock hour. If you are unable to say chaplet, simply recalling the time of Christ's passionate death on the Cross for a brief moment is accepted. Do it every day or say the Stations of the Cross.

Won't you please come and join us praying and venerating the Holy Image of the Divine Mercy on **April 24, 2022, Sunday, after the 11:45am Mass?**
