

The faithful life of a hermit

A hermit, also called **Eremite**, is defined as one who retires from society, primarily for religious reasons, and lives in solitude. The first Christian hermits appeared by the end of the 3rd century in Egypt, where one reaction to the persecution of Christians by the Roman emperor Decius was flight into the desert to preserve the faith and to lead a life of prayer and penance.

The eremitic life nearly died out in Western Christianity, but it has continued in Eastern Christianity. The 1983 Code of Canon Law made particular provisions for men and women who felt a calling to consecrate themselves to God through the hermitic life without the necessity of being a member of a religious congregation or institute.

Some hermits make private vows of chastity and poverty, either with a priest as a witness or on their own. However, in the Catholic Church, there are those who choose to take vows of chastity, poverty, or obedience, publicly.

For laypeople, discernment may unfold over many years. Their primary formation will have been through secular life; their secondary formation will be into the eremitic vocation, however determined in a diocese. To become a canonical hermit, she must be accepted and consecrated at Mass under canon 603 by the local bishop. Diocesan hermits consecrated under canon 603 invariably have to negotiate and provide their own means of support, shelter, and income.

Ursula Kuiee and Avia Montoya will profess their perpetual vows and will be consecrated as hermits in the Diocese of Honolulu at the 9 am Mass on August 28th with Bishop Larry Silva presiding.

Their lives as hermits will be one of prayer for the Pope, the Bishop, and Priests. Their daily lives will be regulated by a Rule of Life which Bishop Silva will approve on the 28th. The Rule of Life has what is called a horarium, which is like a schedule. The horarium helps to govern their time and their actions, but it has a greater purpose than that, and that is to develop very healthy, good habits in their daily lives so that they can have their hearts free in order to be able to engage in prayer. Ursula and Avia will pledge to devote their lives to the praise of God and salvation of the world through a stricter separation from the world, the silence of solitude and diligent prayer and penance.

We join Bishop Silva in welcoming Sister Ursula and Sister Avia.
