Epiphany of our Lord – 2022

The People in darkness have seen a great light

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord traditionally called the Feast of the Three Kings. The *magi or wise men* whom we call kings, were led by the light of star in their search for the child who was born on Christmas Day. Their journey had been long and arduous. And when they finally meet him, they presented him with their gifts, a little bit strange for a baby but their homage and adoration are real.
