4th Sunday of Lent – (A) 2023

I am the light of the World

The Kingdom of God has been unfolding in our midst but man fails to recognize it because of the darkness that has filled our eyes. As light of the world, Our Lord Jesus wants to provide us with the gift of vision – the eyes of faith - to see and to take part in the establishment of God's Kingdom.

This is the invitation as well as the challenge in this Sunday's gospel of the healing of the blind man. But more than just about physical blindness the concern of Jesus is geared towards spiritual blindness as exhibited by the pharisees as well as the apostles. With the Pharisee, they have closed their eyes and their hearts to the person of Jesus. Envy and jealousy have blinded them from recognizing the hands of God as they work in the lives of people. The Apostles on the other hand are asking who sinned, manifested a blindness brought about by their religious prejudices.

The journey of the blind man toward greater insight about Jesus is a journey we are all called to make. The gospel challenges each one of us to look into our own blind spots. How often do we judge rashly and fail to see things as they really are? How often do we let our fears impair our vision like the parents of the blind man. Other times we think we know it all like the Pharisees and fail to recognize the surprises of God in our lives. We all need to reflect on our spiritual blindness - those obstacles that hinder us from recognizing God so that we might see the Lord clearly with the eyes of faith and thus be able to follow him more faithfully and lovingly.

St Joseph School Annual 2nd Collection

On the weekend of March 18-19 all parishes in the East Hawaii Vicariate will be holding the annual second collection for St. Joseph School. Envelopes are available for those who want them.



The 4th Sunday of Lent—also known as Laetare Sunday—looks hopefully towards Easter. Clergy may wear rose vestments instead of purple. Flowers may be used at the altar, but sparingly. The entrance antiphon begins, "Rejoice, Jerusalem;" in Latin: "Laetare, Jerusalem..." but we're still only halfway to Easter.

As the faithful journey through Lent, we are joined by the elect, those who will receive the sacraments of initiation (baptism, confirmation, holy communion) at the Easter Vigil. They celebrate the scrutinies on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent. This period of purification and enlightenment is meant to "uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all this is upright, strong, and good." The presider is encouraged to carry out the scrutinies in such a way that the assembly also benefits from the liturgy. The scrutinies and the Gospels (the Samaritan woman at the well; the man born blind; the resurrection of Lazarus by Jesus) are meant to guide the elect in "their perception of sin and their desire for salvation."

Their progress in these last weeks is an example to the assembly of striving for conversion and a reminder that we must also persist in our efforts. How is the Holy Spirit guiding us through Lent to prepare ourselves to fully witness the Resurrection of our Lord? Perhaps sitting quietly in personal prayer, going to the sacrament of reconciliation, attending the parish recollection, or collecting palms with your family for Palm Sunday. There's still time!
