11th Sunday in Ordinary time - B "This is how it is with the kingdom of God.."

This Sunday's gospel has two parable. But why would Our Lord Jesus "not speak to them except in parables?" For the simple reason that parables speak to the lives of the most ordinary listener. A parable is like a wick of a candle; it isn't worth a lot, but the light it produces may help to discover a treasure.

The parables of the seed growing by itself and Mustard Seed point to the nature of Reign of God. God's kingdom is living and dynamic. While The Kingdom of God may require our collaboration, it is first and foremost, a grace and a gift coming from God. It is not primarily a product of human effort. As a seed has a built-in power to grow to maturity. The second parable of the Mustard seed teaches that His Reign, though of humble beginnings, is destined for greatness.

There is one thing though about God's Reign that we should be conscious of: it is already here but at the same time, is not yet. Already here because Christ had established it with His coming. Not yet, because truth, justice, love, and peace have yet to permeate all aspects of human activities. God is continually at work and in due time His Reign will be established in its fullness. But this is not God's work alone. He desires that we participate in its fulfilment. God provides the grace necessary it is up for us to put them into good use.

We are called to be God's partner in making this world just as He intends it to be. Thus, if I want a better world, then let the work of cultivating it begin with me!

Celebrating Fatherhood: Taking Inspiration from St. Joseph

There is no cost to attend!! But please RSVP by calling the parish office at 808-326-7771 by June 21st.




