Whoever does the will of God...

“Ohana” is one of the most revered words in Hawaii. Primarily it means family but ‘ohana encompasses loving relationships with not just blood relatives but with all members of the human family. To embrace Ohana is to embrace humanity.

And such loving relationship is what is envisioned by Jesus when he chose to be born into a human family. To be human is to uphold and respect the role of family in a person’s life. And this reflected in the way Jesus honors and respect Mary and Joseph as his parents. But Jesus is also quick to recognize that more than just being related through blood, family is tracing our connectedness with God, who is the source of all life. And this connectedness is manifested through carrying out God’s will.

Jesus will be the first to affirm the significance of Mary's motherhood. But she is also the first disciple, when she declared “let it be done to me according to your word.” The true strength of human family lies in their willingness to hear the word of God and live by it. And this will be their truest blessing!

When we allow God to enter our life, when we discover God in the hearing of His word, we also discover ourselves in the process and will be the opening to be able to live our lives to the fullest just like Mary, who is blest because she is the mother of our Lord Jesus and our model in listening to the Word of God and rejoicing in it.

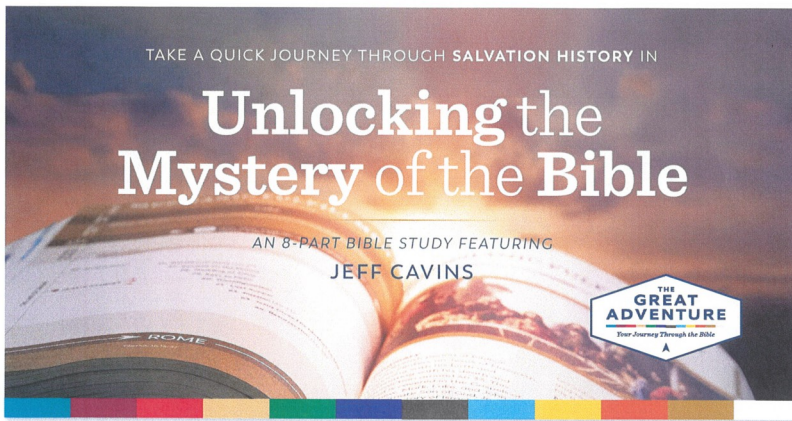

Who Packs Your Parachute?

Charles Plum, a U.S. Naval Academy graduate, was a jet fighter pilot in Vietnam. After 75 combat missions, his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plum ejected and parachuted into enemy hands. He was captured and spent six years in a Communist prison. He survived that ordeal and now lectures about lessons learned from that experience.

One day, when Plum and his wife were sitting in a restaurant, a man at another table came up and said, “You’re Plum! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!”

“How in the world did you know that?” asked Plum.

“I packed your parachute,” the man replied. Plum gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man pumped his hand and said, “I guess it worked!”

Plum assured him, “It sure did – if your chute hadn’t worked, I wouldn’t be here today.”

Plum couldn’t sleep that night, thinking about that man. Plum says, “I kept wondering what he might have looked like in a Navy uniform – a Dixie cup hat, a bib in the back, and bell bottom trousers. I wondered how many times I might have passed him on the Kitty Hawk. I wondered how many times I might have seen him and not even said ‘Good morning, how are you,’ or anything because, you see, I was a fighter pilot, and he was just a sailor.”


Plum thought of the many hours the sailor had spent on a long wooden table in the bowels of the ship carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each chute, holding in his hands each time the fate of someone he didn’t know.

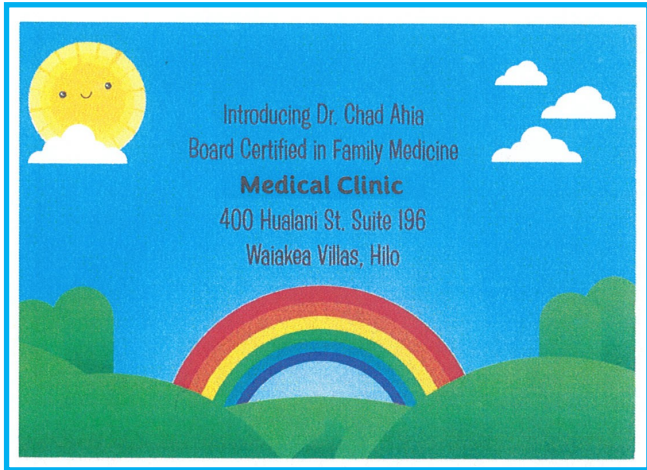
Now, Plum asks his audience, “Who’s packing your parachute? Everyone has someone who provides what they need to make it through the day.”
