6th Sunday of Easter – 2024 (B)

“Love one another as I love you.”

Still part of His farewell discourse to His disciples, Our Lord Jesus instructs them: “Love one another as I love you.” We need to go back and really take these words of Jesus to heart over and over again. The key to the problems of our world is love, and loving more.

One who dares to love must also be open to receive the gift of love, especially from its source who is God Himself. Since God is love, and His love is infinite, one who is connected with God has therefore a constant and unending source of the energy called love.

In His Encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est*, Pope Benedict XVI distinguishes two kinds of love. First is the natural human drive called eros. It is the love that seeks union with another person, with its expectation of mutual love and happiness. He calls it as ascending love. One goes up to the heights of passion. The second one is agape or caritas. It is the love that seeks to sacrifice self for the sake of another. This is referred to as descending love. One gives up self, or descends for the sake of the beloved.

Jesus took the risk of experiencing hurts and pains when He chose to love us and make us his friends. But he kept on loving, even at the cost of His life. Jesus tells us that he desires to be our friend and he loves us wholeheartedly and unconditionally. And if we open our hearts to his love and obey his command to love our neighbor, then we will bear much fruit in our lives, fruit that will last for eternity.

So are you ready to accept Jesus’ offer of friendship?
