"Which is the first of all the commandments?"

The response of Jesus to the question of the scribe in the Gospel is nothing new in the hearing of an ordinary Jew in Israel. Even today, devout Jews recite their promise to God every day in the Shema Israel: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength." But sometimes we easily take for granted the ordinary realities of life in the desire to be exceptional. Jesus wants to ground us in this foundational law of love in our everyday living. And He did so by embracing the Father's will wholeheartedly and truly caring for everyone of God's children. His love for his Father is reflected in his love for people.

St. Thomas Aquinas asserted: "bonum diffusivum sui," good is diffusive of itself. "It simply means that Goodness is not confined within itself – it is meant to be communicated – to be shared. Thus, God had to share his beauty, his love and his joy with us, and that is why He created us. Jesus, the perfect image of the Father, had to share the Father's joy with us. Everything that Jesus did manifested the Father's love for us.

We cannot force anyone to love us. Like Jesus, we must love each other freely. The commandment to love one another is really an invitation to share in His joy and the creative joy of His Father. And this communicating of the goodness of God is what we celebrate in every Eucharist - Jesus giving Himself to be our joy, our hope and our nourishment to be the channel of God's goodness!

How are we going to imitate Jesus this week?


Book of life


