their hearts are far from me;

Jesus didn't hesitate to call the scribes and Pharisees hypocrites right to their faces, charging that they had forgotten what truly makes a person sick. While the Pharisees were talking about food that goes in one end and out the other, Jesus was referring to the sickness of the soul.

The Pharisees believed their hearts as well as their inner life were okay. After all they have strictly observed the law and that is what is important. For them, this is what it means to be holy. He reminded them of the most serious diseases that society did not seem to notice: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly - to name a few. These illnesses did not come from a failure to be ritually pure or from unclean foods. These sicknesses come from the heart

And Christ denounced such external observance as plain hypocrisy for it did not draw them closer to God and His desire that we be extraordinary channels of love and compassion for one another. In fact, "their hearts are far from me." We have therefore to learn from Christ what true holiness means. Christ witnessed to us that God did not choose to separate Himself from mankind but instead He chose to be one with us except in sin. In doing so, Jesus was bringing back the original dignity of man – our original holiness, which is to be true to the person that our Creator intended us to be. Or put in another way, true holiness therefore is to be true to who we are as God's creatures. Thus the question will be: Made in the likeness of God, do we reflect the presence of God in our lives?
