## "Ephphatha"

It is easy to sympathize with people who are blind and lame because their handicap is guite evident. But not so with those who have hearing impediments. We get irritated and annoyed. And if this is how we feel, how much more for one who has this hearing and speech impediment? The more they feel shut out by the society.

In the Gospel, Jesus must have recognized the struggle and pain of this deaf and mute man. That is why instead of getting annoyed, Jesus reached out to him. To heal him, he spoke this powerful word: "Ephphatha", which means "Be Opened." To be open to the loving Presence of God in one's life – to be open to His Love and mercy. Thus, more than a word of command, I believe for Jesus it was a prayer! Yes, a prayer for healing but also for hope and empowerment.

For us today, this man represents all who have turned a deaf ear to God's word and have turned mute in their Christian witness. And Jesus prays again: "Ephphatha!" he desires that our ears, our eyes, our minds, and our hearts be opened to God's love and His Word. It is about being receptive to the ways God is speaking to us – through the Scripture, the church, the people around us and in the events of our daily lives. And then when our lives are so filled with God's presence, we open our mouths and proclaim his Good News.
