

19th Sunday In Ordinary Time - 2025 *"You also must be prepared..."*

How prepared were you when we had the tsunami alert last week?

Most of us believe in preparation for many uncertainties. We carry a spare tire in our car in case of a flat tire. We have security cameras installed as a precaution for theft. We keep an emergency kit in case of an earthquake or tsunami. Preparation in our society is a sign of wisdom. But think about this. Not a single one is a certainty – yet we feel compelled to prepare ourselves for them. And yet, are we prepared, or are we preparing for the most crucial moment of our lives, which is the return of our Lord Jesus?

The parable of today's gospel focuses on the unpredictable return of Jesus and our need to be prepared for his return – "You also must be prepared, for an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." The return of Jesus is a certainty. Yes, we can never know precisely when he will return, but his return is certain. We must constantly watch, being always faithful and ready so that we may be found worthy to share in the heavenly banquet he has prepared for us. So the question of the parable is not whether or not Christ is coming again, or when he is coming, or even how he is coming. The point is about being prepared for his coming and ready to receive him whenever he comes, now or later.

On the road of life which we follow, there are many uncertainties and distractions. But our preparation cannot be when we have the time, but living each moment of our life for Jesus. If we can do that, we will be prepared to greet our Master whenever He comes.

The Kingdom is coming. The Master will return. But we don't wait with fear – we wait with love, joy and readiness.


