16th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 2025

"You are anxious and worried about many things .."

I will not be surprised if someone says that the biggest obstacle to welcoming Christ today is our busyness. We are too busy to pray. We are too busy to spend time with our loved ones. We are too busy to reach out to others in need. But the worst part is that we think that being busy is a compliment, even a virtue – being busy means we are valuable. We have overlooked the fact that in our busyness, we might have turned a blind eye to what truly matters in life. And while welcoming Jesus when He comes knocking on our door is one of life's priorities, are we ready to offer him true hospitality?

This Sunday's readings give us a picture of biblical hospitality. Abraham welcomed the three strangers and prepared a dinner for them. Likewise, we have Jesus being welcomed by Mary and Martha into their home and preparing a dinner for him. But at the end, it was the hosts, Abraham and Mary, and Martha, who were surprised by the gifts that their guests brought with them – for Abraham the gift of a promise of a son, and Mary and Martha the gift of the Presence of Jesus.

But a right focus is necessary, otherwise we might fail to recognize the gift - "Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is a need for only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." Jesus reminder to Martha and all of us is very clear: His Person and His Word have primacy; everything else is secondary.


Order of Christian Initiation for Adults
