

"Lord, teach us to pray"

How often do we feel uncertain in our own prayer lives? We might not know what to say or feel like God is distant. Perhaps we've requested something and haven't received a response. Like the disciples, we also ask: "Lord, teach us to pray." This humble request from the disciples echoes in every human heart – even today, whether we have prayed our whole lives or are just beginning.

The disciples must have seen something in the way Jesus prayed – something deep, intimate, and alive. And all because for Jesus, prayer was not just something He did. It was at the very core of who He is. That is why when he taught His disciples how to pray, he did not teach them a technique or a formula. Instead, he begins by acknowledging a relationship between man and God: "Father..." In this one word, Jesus reveals the heart of all true prayer.

Prayer is not a magic incantation. It is not just reciting words. Prayer is entering a relationship with God, who is not only our creator but most of all a loving Father!

Prayer is not just about talking to God. It is being with God, the one who calls us His beloved children.

The Sacrament of Confirmation

- ◆ The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) states, "Baptism, the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Confirmation constitute the sacraments of Christian initiation, whose unity must be safeguarded. The reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of Baptismal Grace" (CCC 1285). "Every Baptized person not yet Confirmed can and should receive the Sacrament of Confirmation... for without Confirmation and Eucharist, Baptism is certainly valid and efficacious, but Christian initiation remains incomplete." (CCC 1306)
- Many faithful Catholic adults grew up when Confirmation was not offered until their middle or high school years. Some were not aware that Confirmation was available for them and so they were never Confirmed. If you are a baptized adult who has not yet been Confirmed join us on Monday August 11 at 5:30 PM in the rectory library for a brief meeting on adult faith formation and preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation

Fathers, Mothers, Grandparents and Godparents,

Our 2026 **Religious Education** year is slated to start this September. If your children have reached the age of 7 and have not studied for and received the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation, now is the time to sign them up for instruction to begin this Fall. Classes are held on Sunday morning between the 9 o'clock Mass and the 11:45 am Mass. That allows you to have your children attend Religious Education and to attend Mass as well. We have very fine dedicated instructors in place to help your children their Faith and to prepare them for their Sacraments. If your children have reached their teen years and have not received their Sacraments, not to worry, we have a very dynamic couple providing instruction for them.
